670.2	County Councillor – report circulated prior to the meeting:		
	<b>DCC Budgets</b> – Final figures to be finalised but it is looking like the County Council will have come in with a small underspend for the outgoing financial year. Having delivered two balanced budgets in successive years without the need to raid reserves to balance the books this puts the Council in a strong position and gives the organisation time and space now to restructure and modernise.		
	<b>Restructures</b> – Several internal restructures within the Council are ongoing. There will be some redundancies though the actual number at this stage is still likely to be small as the Council are looking to redeploy staff to new roles or different positions as and when people leave the organisation.		
	<b>Modernisation</b> – As part of the restructure and modernisation the Council's estate is being reviewed to look at repurposing buildings, whether it is for community use, key worker accommodation, etc., or to dispose of it if the buildings are no longer required. Current measures have already generated some significant savings which are likely to be re-invested into Highways I should be able to report in more detail on this next month.		
	<b>Devolution</b> – Consultation is due to close shortly and I will give a full update for my May report. I would reiterate my own view that Devolution is good for Devon and is good for our area. It gives us the opportunity to gain direct powers from Government, and access to funding from Government in a way that Parish, District and County Councils all acting separately have not been able to draw down. I will report back on the consultation findings which are due to be discussed by DCC Cabinet and Full Council later this month.		
	<b>Community Library Update</b> – Libraries Unlimited have been in touch with the Parish Hall and discussions have gone well and are ongoing. From an update I had from Sue Lee, we are aiming for an opening in mid-May if all goes well.

	Demolition works on site is progressing well and due to be completed next week. The next phase will be engineering in nature and the		

construction of the new quay wall by the autumn of 2024. The site perimeters have been secured and with random security patrols. The planning application for Development is being worked through for Presentation at the July Planning Committee.

#### Current First Past the Post (FPTP) to PR:

A notice of Motion was raised by Councillor Thomas regarding voter apathy, disconnection form local and national democracy with our current FPTP voting system. Proportional Representation (PR) ensures that all votes count with equal value and seats won match votes cast. The Single Transferable vote (STV) variant is already used in Scotland and Wales.

With PR in Scotland this led to an increase in turnout which was 48% at the last elections in 2022 and the Welsh Assembly agreed to change their voting system in 2021.

Unfortunately, on this occasion the vote by council members was close 14 to 12 in favour of maintaining the FPTP.

#### Potholes and State of Roads:

Following on from our previous Full Council Meeting and unanimous motion regarding the poor state of roads, we are waiting to hear from Devon County Council.

## External O&S:

Active Torridge- talking about their progress since setting up the councilowned company. Active Torridge runs the leisure centres at Holsworthy and Northam and the pool in Torrington. Northam gym is pretty much full for gym and classes, so plans are in place to set up a gym in Bideford at the old library.

Lendology CIC- worked in partnership with TDC since 2008, providing home-improvement loans with only 4% interest, open to anyone regardless of income. It all sounded positive so please spread the word.

## Climate change Working Group:

We (TDC) are working towards having an Air Quality Strategy by the end of 2024.

Currently TDC is monitoring air quality in our main towns with 18 Diffusion tubes and pleased to report we are operating well under the Government guidelines of below 40ug.

Air quality claims many lives, and it's been identified with vehicle traffic is idling, slow moving traffic and in and around schools. High levels of
